SPECIALTIES WITH A "PATIENT WAIT LIST" AND CURRENT URGENCY LEVEL TIMELINE

As the Project Access model operates entirely with donated care, there are times when our available services become limited. The following specialties currently have a "patient wait list":

- •Orthopedics/Spine •Urology •General Surgery •Gynecology/Oncology
- Ophthalmology (retinal, corneal and glaucoma issues only)

Please be sure to indicate the urgency level when you submit your referral. Date of submission and urgency levels are always considered when processing orders. For <u>NEW</u> referrals the current urgency level timeline is as follows:

Urgency 1: No longer than four weeks. (Unless surgery has already been scheduled and/or treatment is urgent and needs to be evaluated as specified by APA provider.)

Urgency 2: four-five weeks Urgency 3: five-six weeks Urgency 4: six-eight weeks

Primary Care/Self Referrals: six-eight weeks

APA staff does their very best to accommodate all referrals. We appreciate your patience.

SUGGESTION BOX

It was recently brought to our attention that some APA patients did not have a primary care home. While we've always operated on the premise that APA patients do have a primary care home, when a patient is a direct referral from one of our specialists, we are not always cognizant of the patient's primary care



status. In the future, when a patient is referred to APA for eligibility from any source, they will be assigned a primary care physician if they do not have one. Our referral form has been updated to reflect this change. Our sincere thanks to one of our orthopedic surgeons for bringing this to our attention.
